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PROSTATE SPECIFIC ANTIGEN (PSA)

TEST	RESULT	UNIT	REFERENCE
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An elevated PSA level is suggestive of cancer but there are other possible causes of an elevated PSA level. These include benign conditions such as Prostatitis and Benign Prostatic Hyperplasia (BPH). Also, a recent rectal examination can cause a rise in PSA levels. An elevated PSA level done alone does not give enough information to distinguish between benign prostatic conditions and cancer. A prostate biopsy is the confirmatory test to diagnose cancer of the prostate
